

At both meetings the presentations were on the New Jersey based nonprofit organization Community Hope.

At our Woman's Club Evening Meeting, Peggy Banko, development, director of community. Peggy began with Community Hope's mission statement. *"Our mission is to be a beacon of Hope in our community, connecting individuals and families with life-changing support services and housing that foster the independence and resilience to live their best lives."*

This is some of the information on Community Hope that Peggy Banko shared with us. Community Hope was found in 1985 to help families whose members suffered from mental health to give them affordable safe housing with needed medical services. There is a large percentage of US veterans that are homeless and at risk of suicide.

In 2004 Community Hope, collaborating with NJ VA, started a program, reaching out to Homeless Veterans

Community Hope has a new program which offers to Women Veterans and their children housing, medical care and financial assistance, many of these women veterans being single parents. There is now a veteran case management program, an outreach program. Many events are organized, throughout the year to raise money and awareness of Community Hope. Community Hope gets its money from Grants and Fundraisers the organization organizes. Some of the ways one could help Community Hope are; sponsor an event, organize bake sales to raise money for Community Hope, organize collections for items recipients need for their allotted apartments, organize food collections. Monetary gifts and gift cards from supermarkets like ShopRite are



greatly appreciated. In 2023 Community Hope reached out to a record 693 people in need.

Mabel Smith Douglass, a woman of vision and action, born in Jersey City, graduate of Dickinson High School and Barnard College, wife of William Douglass, mother of two, was the catalyst for the establishment of the New Jersey College for Women. As a member of the College Club, she was active in counseling young women to continue their education at nearby institutes of higher learning outside of New Jersey as women were not eligible for enrollment at Rutgers. She persuaded the group to join the New Jersey State Federation of Women's Clubs (NJSFWC) to campaign for the higher

education of youth in New Jersey, regardless of sex, and accepted the position of Chairman of a Committee on the State College and actively researched the numbers, visited separate colleges for women, met with public officials including U.S. President Woodrow Wilson and launched a campaign to raise funds. Due to health issues she retired from the project in 1915, but she had laid the groundwork, and the project was taken over by the NJSFWC. After he died, she took over management of her husband's mercantile business. In 1918 the trustees of Rutgers passed a resolution to establish a college for women and the New Jersey College for Women opened with 54 students. The president of Rutgers asked Douglass to be the first dean of the college, where she spent the next 14 years. In 1956 the college would be named Douglass College in her honor. Mabel Smith Douglass was a woman who acted on her vision, a woman whose legacy is one of giving thousands of women the opportunity to pursue higher education in the state of New Jersey. *Article recommended by Nancy Levy*
