
### **November Events**

The need is going up but the shelves are almost empty ... Last month the Rockaway Food Closet spent \$5,000 to purchase food to distribute.

We are unable to hold a food drive outside of Shoprite until next year so we are holding a mini food drive among our membership during November. Bring any of the items listed below to the November 10<sup>th</sup> meeting. Food will be apportioned between the 2 Food Closets based on need.

Non-Perishables (Breakfast cereal, tuna, peanut butter, canned veggies, ramen, soup, crackers, drinks, desserts, cookies, canned fruit, canned meals, pasta, mac and cheese, beans, 2 lb. bags of rice, snacks, shelf stable milk (whole or 2%), coffee, tea, pasta/rice sides (Rice-A-Roni or Knorr) etc.)

Health & Beauty Products (soap, bath gel/wash, shampoo, deodorant, toothpaste, toothbrush, laundry detergent etc.)



This month strives to promote this declaration, and the continuing struggles people face throughout the world, encouraging us to not leave anyone behind.

2025 – 60th Anniversary of Civil Rights March from Selma to Montgomery, Alabama Selma to Montgomery March resulted in Voting Rights Act of 1965 signed by Pres. Lyndon Johnson August 6th,

March 7<sup>th</sup>, 1965, civil rights marchers, including John Lewis were attacked on the Edmund Pettus Bridge in Selma by Alabama state troopers, in their attempt to march to Montgomery. This was known as "Bloody Sunday". Pres. Lyndon B. Johnson federalized the Alabama National Guard to protect the marchers on the March 25th Selma to Montgomery March after Governor Wallace refused to ensure their safety.



- It takes a very long time to accumulate enough cell phones to redeem and we don't know the redemption value until they are sent back. The company does provide prepaid labels, so it doesn't cost us anything to recycle them.
- We no longer have contact with a company who will pay us for the ink cartridges, but we are recycling them so instead of tossing them in the trash give them to Joan Bowling.
- The eyeglasses are given to the Lion's Club who work with groups that send eyeglasses to third world countries. In our mission to reduce, reuse and recycle we are trying hard. Please bring these items to a meeting and give them to Joan Bowling.

\*Greeting Cards - Nancy Levy. Collecting the fronts of any type of greeting card.

\*Birthday Bags – Joanne Chiaravalloti. The Birthday Bag items consist of cake mixes, frosting, small birthday design plates and napkins, candles and a birthday gift bag. Joanne puts them together and gives them to Social Services for children.
