#### January 8<sup>th</sup> - Monday- W.C. Club Eve Meeting - (Denville Community Church)

**Presentation by Kelly McNamara** 



**Exec. Director of St. Peter's Orphanage**, for 27 years. Stephany started with the acknowledgment that January is human traffic awareness month seeing that our members were all wearing blue to commemorate the event. Sadly, she pointed out, that a young man, entering St. Peter's Orphanage, has been a victim of human trafficking.

Kelly, after she asked us what we know of St. Peter 's Orphanage, explained that the organization takes boys from ages 15 to 19 years (In the NJ state foster system) to receive the proficient professional assistance they need. At this point, there are five young men living at St. Peter's Orphanage.

**Guest Speaker Kelly McNamara.** 

Those young men, who have arrived at St. Peter's Orphanage, have gone through multiple adoptions as well as foster homes and lots of trauma. Kelly explained that St. Peter's Orphanage offers a home where the young men continue schooling, have daily dinners together and receive the psychological services and any other services they need. The young men are taken to restaurants, movies, games, and bowling to give them normalcy in their lives. There is a big emphasis, at St. Peter's Orphanage on education, knowing these young men will have to be out on their own by the age of 21 years. They are given help in getting drivers' licenses, jobs, and opening savings accounts to enable these young men to become self-sufficient adults. After Kelly's presentation, she asked if anyone had questions.

Kelly explained that St Peter's Orphanage started as an organization under the archdiocese in Newark in 1869. In 1971 St Peters Orphanage moved to Denville becoming a nonprofit 501c3 organization, no longer under the archdiocese. Kelly mentioned that donations of nonperishable foods, gift certificates flowers for spring planting and monetary gifts are greatly appreciated. Our President, Janet Walker thanked Kelly McNamara for her presentation. Nancy Levy asked about fast-food gift certificates which Kelly replied, though healthy food, in St Peter's Orphanage, is emphasized these gift certificates are greatly appreciated in offering these young men normalcy in their lives. And with that said Nancy gave Kelly (3) \$10 Dunkin' Doughnut gift cards.

### **January Events- Continued** January 9th-Tuesday- W.C. Day Meeting (Denville Town Hall- Community Room)



Presentation by Stephanie Tansey Operation Director of Roots and Wings. Stephanie started by pointing out that Roots and Wings is celebrating its 25th anniversary this year. In 1999 Irene DeGrandpre found this organization, in Morris County, for young people, aging out of foster care between the age of 18 and 21 years. Roots and Wings started as a grassroot movement, where Irene DeGrandpre took in aged out of the foster care system young people into her home. Eventually Roots and Wings became a nonprofit 501c3 organization. The mission, Stephanie pointed out, of Roots and Wings, is to give safe housing, emotional support, life skills and educational opportunities for young people aging out of foster care system in New Jersey and empowering them to reach their full potential. Each year, Stephanie claimed, hundreds of young people age out of foster care in New Jersey. Stephanie went over statistics. 1 out 5 young people aging out of foster

care, in New Jersey, become homeless. Only 27% of them graduate from high school or any technical school with a degree. Only 6% receive a college degree. More than 80% out of the system are incarcerated. The average number of these young people, Stephanie further claimed, have been in at least 5 different foster homes, homeless, unemployed, or under employed. Roots and Wings program, Stephanie continued, offers safe housing. However, to qualify, these young people must be in foster care system at some point. They must adhere to the Roots and Wings program by being in some educational program, even studying a trade, at time of applying. Being in an education program will provide stability when they graduate from the program. Aside from housing, Roots and Wings give these young people life skill training, help them in obtaining drivers licenses and purchasing a car as well as receiving mental health treatment, if needed. Stephanie gave examples of the good outcomes these young people clients achieved from Roots and Wings. Stephanie added that Roots and Wings organize holiday parties for their clients where volunteers supply the food and wish lists are drawn up, posted on Amazon.

Stephanie, answering Karen Lazur's questions, said that good way to support these young people are food drives, gift cards and new items needed for their apartments. Presently Stephanie said there are 14 young people being served by Roots and Wings. Roots and Wings, located is in Denville.

Woman's Club of Parsippany-Troy Hills Hosts the Highlands District Day of Service PARSIPPANY — On January 15, 2024, which marked Martin Luther King Day, eight clubs affiliated with the New Jersey State Federation of Women's Clubs (NJSFWC) came together for a noble cause. They actively participated in the 2024 NJSFWC Day of Service held at the Parsippany PAL Building.

This year's Day of Service was dedicated to aiding victims of domestic violence, highlighting the importance of addressing this pressing issue in society. Several prominent agencies joined hands to support this initiative, including Domestic Abuse & Sexual Assault Intervention Services (DASI) from Sussex County, Domestic Abuse & Sexual Assault Crisis Center (DASAAC) from Warren County, JBWS, and Homeless Solutions Morristown Family Shelter, all located in Morris County. To facilitate their charitable efforts, each agency provided lists of essential items that the club members could donate. These generous contributions were brought to the Day of Service event, where forty-one dedicated members from various clubs worked diligently to sort and package over 875 items. These items were subsequently handed over to the respective agencies for distribution among their clients in need.

The event saw the presence of Diane Williams, CEO of JBWS, who expressed her gratitude to the participants for their invaluable support in assisting victims of domestic abuse. She reminded everyone of the significance of their efforts, emphasizing that each one of us may know someone in need of help in such challenging situations.

These items were diligently packed by the ladies along with some of the donated items to create kits for new arrivals, who often come with nothing but the clothes on their backs......




National Wear Red Day is February 2, 2024 (Go red for Women)

February is Black History Month—an occasion to single out and honor black citizens who have made lasting and positive contributions to American society. Such a person was Sojourner Truth (1797-1883), a heroic black woman who worked against slavery in states from Maine to Kansas. She spent her last years in Battle Creek, Michigan, and her life is a study in how black and white Americans worked together for a more free and just society.

(Sojourner Truth was among the pioneering women's rights advocates with Susan B. Anthony, and Elizabeth Cady, who also supported abolition of slavery as well.)
